

Bibliography Lt(N) Ret. Marcelle Tremblay

Lieutenant (Navy) Marcelle Tremblay joined the Armed Forces in 1987 as the first female Naval Maritime surface and sub-surface Officer in Canada.

Until 1992, she served in the Regular Forces as a Bridge Watch keeper onboard the destroyers, HMCS Mackenzie and HMCS Qu'appelle.

She, then, became a Surface and Air Weapons Officer, organizing combat exercises and tactical operations onboard HMCS Provider and the Frigate HMCS Ville-de-Quebec.

As other duties, Lieutenant (Navy) Tremblay became the first female Diving Officer and worked in Public Affair promoting the Armed Forces.

In September 1996, she moved to Okotoks and joined the Reserve Unit HMCS Tecumseh in Calgary, where she worked as Public Affair, Training and Diving Officer.

In June 2003, she and her family moved to Qatar in the Middle East for 4 years and then to Brazil for 2 where she worked in the Education field.

Since 2009, Mrs Tremblay and her family including her husband Barry Leslie, who is also a Retired Naval Officer and her 3 children, Simon, Luc and Jasmine Leslie have returned to Okotoks where they plan to stay until the next adventure calls them.
